#### • Public Expression:

Easter Seals is coordinating with Early Head Start to provide services for families that aren't meeting Easter Seals' eligibility requirements. Easter Seals currently has an opening for a 30-hour per week administrative



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assistant. Ty's Blues and Food is holding a toy drive and will be hosting the annual Christmas party for Lake County's foster children.
